<u>The right to life II</u>

Reproductive rights, abortion, suicide and assisted suicide, prenatal and genetic engineering to be dealt with should be dealt with in a preventive, humane and sustainable manner, in full dignity.

Use of force to be avoided, or if impossible limited; To be independently monitored.

Sharing human rights

We recommend that an overseeing regional human rights treaty and mechanism be established in the Pacific Region.

We recommend for such an institution to fully integrate non-conflictive and traditional peaceful settlement of disputes mechanisms.



Participating

We encourage Samoa to grant to the people participation rights, such as rights of referendum on laws and treaties and the right of initiative to amend the constitution.



Constitution making

We recommend amending the constitution to take the death penalty out, but also to highlight the value of life in a more happy and dynamic way.

We recommend the ratification of the second optional protocol of the CCPR on the abolition of the death penalty .
