WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii is blessed by the unselfish contributions of citizens who step forward to provide leadership to guide its people through social and economic challenges; and

WHEREAS, born in Brockton, Massachusetts on June 28, 1929, DR. GLENN D. PAIGE graduated from Princeton University with an A.B. in 1955; from Harvard University with an M.A. in 1957; and from Northwestern University with a Ph.D. in 1959; and

WHEREAS, DR. GLENN D. PAIGE served in the United States Army from 1948 to 1952, during which he attained the rank of captain, participated in the Korean War from 1950 to 1952, and served in the Army Reserve from 1956 to 1960; and

WHEREAS, DR. GLENN D. PAIGE worked as an Assistant Professor of Public Administration at the University of Minnesota from 1959 to 1961; as Assistant to the Associate Professor of Politics at Princeton University from 1961 to 1967; and Professor of Political Science at the University of Hawaii from 1967 to 1992, where he introduced new courses and seminars on political leadership and nonviolent political alternatives; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure at the University of Hawaii, DR. GLENN D. PAIGE helped established the University of Hawaii Center for Korean Studies as well as the Spark M. Matsunaga Institute for Peace and its Center for Global Nonviolence Planning Project, and is currently a Professor Emeritus at the University of Hawaii; and

WHEREAS, DR. GLENN D. PAIGE is the President and Founder of the Center for Nonviolence, a nonprofit organization that was established on October 2, 1994, to facilitate worldwide research, education training, and applications of nonviolent knowledge; and

WHEREAS, Peace Day Hawaii was established through Act 23 on April 18, 2007, with the passage of House Bill 345, introduced by Representative Jon Riki Karamatsu, and the Peace Day Hawaii 2008 event will be held at the Hawaii Convention Center on Sunday, September 21, 2008, which will include a Peace Education Forum and Peace Day Hawaii Celebration Ceremony, during which DR. GLENN D. PAIGE will be honored as a recipient of the Peace Day Hawaii 2008 Award; now, therefore,
