CONGRATULATES DR. GLENN D. PAIGE AS THE RECIPIENT OF THE PEACE DAY HAWAII 2008 AWARD

It is the pleasure of the Senate of the State of Hawaii to congratulate Dr. Glenn D. Paige as the recipient of the Peace Day Hawaii 2008 Award for his lifelong commitment to nonviolence.

Dr. Glenn D. Paige was born in Brockton, Massachusetts on June 28, 1929, and served in the United States Army from 1948-1952. During this time, he participated in the Korean War and attained the rank of captain. His service in the military was preceded by his exemplary accomplishments in the academic world, which included his graduation from Princeton University with a B.A. in Political Science in 1955; Harvard University with a M.A. in 1957; and Northwestern University with a Ph.D. in 1959.

After receiving his doctorate from Northwestern University, Dr. Glenn D. Paige began a long and fruitful career as a professor at various universities across the United States. In 1967, Dr. Glenn D. Paige accepted a professorship at the University of Hawaii at Manoa, where he served as a Professor of Political Science, and is currently Professor Emeritus. Between 1967 and 1992, he introduced new undergraduate courses and graduate seminars on political leadership and nonviolent political alternatives which further diversified the curricula at the University of Hawaii at Manoa.

In addition to his myriad achievements as a professor, Dr. Glenn D. Paige is also the Founder and President of the Center for Global Nonviolence, a non-profit organization dedicated to serving as a contributor to nonviolent global transformation. He also helped to found the University of Hawaii Center for Korean Studies, and the Spark M. Matsunaga Institute for Peace and its Center for Global Nonviolence Planning Project.

Dr. Glenn D. Paige is also the author of various nonviolence texts which have been published in dozens of languages, including his book *Nonkilling Global Political Science*, which has been translated into 29 languages, including Arabic, Chinese, Filipino, Hindi, Japanese and Urdu.

On Hawaii's 2nd annual Peace Day, advocates of nonviolence will convene at the Honolulu Convention Center to recognize Dr. Glenn Paige as the recipient of the Peace Day Hawaii 2008 Award. The day's events include a Peace Education Forum, and a Peace Day Hawaii Celebration Ceremony, during which time Dr. Glenn D. Paige is to be honored as the 2008 recipient of the Peace Day Hawaii Award.

The Senate of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii extends its warmest congratulations to Dr. Glenn D. Paige as the recipient of the Peace Day Hawaii 2008 Award, as well as his achievements in teaching and the promotion of nonviolence knowledge in Hawaii and the world.
